Minister's Chat

This summer as we celebrate the 140^h birthday of Port Carling United Church, have you ever wondered what makes a church? Out of a small beginning this church grew and developed. It was a centre for the teaching of the faith. But there was another important side to the work of the church in those early years. The church, and particularly churchwomen, responded to the needs of the community. They fed the hungry, cared for the sick, comforted the mourning, and taught those eager to learn. In many places if there have been no women there would have been no church. They raised a lot of the money. They fed the construction crews that built the church and helped clean the finished buildings. Women helped pay the bills, fill the pews, and uplift the work in prayers. They taught the children, furnished the manses, and supported the great overseas endeavours of the church.

But their partners were there too, working side by side with them. In the early years men generally staffed the pulpits, and they created structures and rules to help the growing institution function. Laymen hammered and sawed, painted and plastered; they kept the fires burning in winter and the grass cut in summer. Men also helped pay the bills, attended the services, and went to countless meetings. Dedicated men worked in towns and cities and hamlets all over the country.

And the children were there as well in the Sunday schools and midweek groups. They filled the buildings with laughter and hope. Their innocence was a source of inspiration to those who were older and perhaps a little jaded, and their development was one reason for all the work that as done.

How our church has changed over the years, once again chimes and music can be heard coming from our cupola, laughter of little ones from a newly renovated basement where the floor takes on a life of its own. The number of functions held in Hanna

Hall for the church and community has been so important over the last 8 years...more room for all!

On July 26 at our morning service we are going to celebrate Port Carling United Church with music, special presentations and Rev. Johanne Hills as our guest speaker. Come and be part of this extraordinary morning!

VACANCIES ON THE OFFICIAL BOARD

In my role as acting chairperson of the Official Board of our Pastoral Charge, and with advice from the Ministry and Personnel Committee, I want to give you some important information:

First: Over the past few years, there have only been two Official Board meetings per year – May & November. The United Church Manual says that there should be four per year. I would like to consider increasing to either 3 or 4 meetings in 2010. To facilitate this, I am announcing that our fall meeting will be somewhat sooner than last year, on Tuesday October 27, 2009 at 7.15 p.m. at Port Carling United. At this time we will decide on the 2010 meeting schedule.

As well, there are three vacancies on the Official Board, which need to be filled at our October 27 meeting.

1. I have acted as Chairperson this year, in the absence of George Woodward. The position of Chair should be filled by election each year at an annual meeting.
2. Bill Clark has been Official Board Treasurer for many years. He has submitted his resignation effective at the end of 2009.
3. According to the Manual, the Mission and Service fund is supposed to have a separate treasurer. George Woodward and Jan Douglas are currently the co-signers for M & S. Hence we need to officially elect a Treasurer for M & S.

I have asked Karen Finlay and Perry Bowker in Port Carling and Marg Couture and Marion McDonald in Bala to act as a nominations committee. I am asking you to consider your talents and offer to fill one of these vacancies. Please let one of above know that you will let your name stand. In Memory of Dr. George Woodward Chairman of the Official Board

Peacefully, in his 79th year, at St Peter's Hospital in Hamilton, Dr. George Woodward passed away Saturday, June 6, 2009 following his very brave battle with cancer.

To celebrate George's life and to honour his memory friends will gather on Saturday, June 27, at Bala United Church at 11 am for a "Memory Tea." Please plan to join us and share special thoughts and memories of George.

George was a medical doctor and ended up as Chief Administrator of the Hamilton General Hospital. Nobody remembers when he retired to Muskoka but suffice it to say it was quite a while ago. He became Chairman of the Official Board of Bala/Port Carling and also became very involved with Muskoka Presbytery. In everything he did, he was concerned that it was done properly and everyone was treated fairly. He was Chair of the Ministry and Personnel committee at Presbytery again concerned that Ministers, both ordained and lay, were properly looked after.

George was also involved with Fenbrook and Beaver Creek penitentiaries. He was a former chair of the Citizen's Advisory Committee, which makes sure that all inmates are treated fairly. He also did counseling of the inmates and was always present at a time of lock-down - again concerned with the well being of people.

He may well have given up on his medical healing but he was always there when someone was in trouble, when someone needed a shoulder to lean on, when someone needed a champion, when someone needed a friend. Never out in front but always there to back you up.

We will all miss George, or that part of him that was closest to us, but we wish him rest and peace with his God
